Our Programs

Forests

We unite the timber industry, government, environmental groups, landowners, scientists, and non-profits to improve the health of our forests and communities.

Range

We are growing the market for Western Juniper wood products sourced from restoration projects in eastern Oregon. This market funnels millions of dollars to rural community businesses and milling operations each year.

Water

We bring farmers, ranchers, tribes, and conservationists together to share water supplies and protect the West's vital ecosystems, economies, and native cultures.

Green Markets

We are creating new markets for local, responsibly-sourced wood products and growing the network of businesses that supply wood from well-managed forests.

Energy

We are piloting and scaling new models of renewable energy financing, and providing technical assistance and energy and water efficiency tools to tribes, farmers, ranchers, and small businesses across Oregon.
