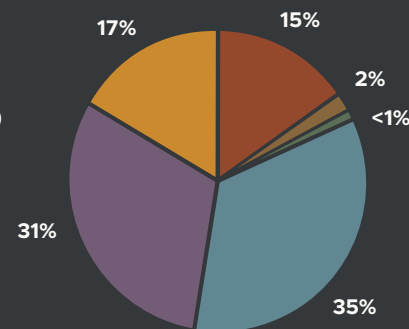

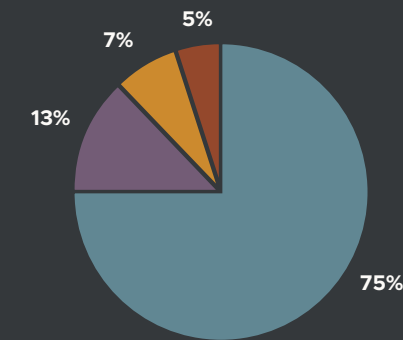

## **KLAMATH DAM TRANSFER OF LICENSE APPROVED**

On June 17, 2021, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) approved the transfer of the license for the Lower Klamath Hydroelectric Project (Project) from PacifiCorp to the Klamath River Renewal Corporation and the states of Oregon and California as co-licensees.

The Commission concluded that the transferee is qualified to hold the license and operate the project and that a transfer is in the public interest. The Transfer Order is a critical step for dam surrender and decommissioning. The dams are scheduled for removal in 2024. Despite the painful struggles the Basin faces in this current drought, we take a moment to celebrate.



## **OREGON ENACTS COMPREHENSIVE WILDFIRE LEGISLATION**

Sustainable Northwest vigorously advocated for the passage of Senate Bill 762, the largest and most significant piece of wildfire policy reform in Oregon state history. Senate Bill 762 is a comprehensive approach to community preparedness and response to future wildfire events.

The wildfire legislation invests \$195 million to enhance wildfire readiness and response, protect the public from the health impacts of wildfire smoke, save money through strategic prevention, and support community and landscape resilience. We must relearn to live safely with fire by investing in and preparing our communities to develop the capacity to manage future wildfires and dedicate adequate resources to restore forest landscape resiliency.



## **1,500 ACRES OF WORKING FOREST CONSERVED**

Throughout 2021 Columbia Land Trust, GreenWood Resources, North Coast Land Conservancy, U.S. Forest Capital, and Sustainable Northwest successfully achieved major funding milestones and are proud to announce the conservation of 1,500 acres of forestland along Highway 101 between the towns of Astoria and Seaside in Clatsop County, Oregon.

Columbia Land Trust's purchase of a conservation easement protects the newly-created Arch Cape Forest from future development or subdivision, ensures tribal and public access, and preserves water quality and high-quality elk habitat.



## **WORKING IN WASHINGTON 20 YEARS & COUNTING!**

Sustainable Northwest has been working in Washington for nearly 20 years, including direct assistance to Forest Collaboratives and Tribal Governments in the state to accelerate the pace and scale of forest restoration. In 2014, we created and launched the Washington Forest Collaboratives Network, to share knowledge and build support for forest collaboratives at the state level. This network creates a place to readily share innovations and successes in project design and implementation across Collaboratives. Over the last few years, Sustainable Northwest has provided collaborative facilitation services for the Kalispel Tribe of Indians on a Tribal Forest Protection Act project and the Northeast Washington Forest Coalition. We also have a long history of supporting wood products businesses and responsible forest stewardship, including 30 businesses in our FSC group chain of custody in the state.

Sustainable Northwest is committed to increasing our program of work in Washington to provide more services and direct assistance to Forest Collaboratives, Forest Service Districts, and Tribal Governments. To accomplish this, we have created a Public Forestlands Program Manager position based in Washington! This allows us to be on the ground in more places as we work across the diverse Washington landscapes to improve forest health, restore fish & wildlife habitat, and create economic opportunities in rural communities.
