



REGENERATIVE RANCHING



In 2022, Sustainable Northwest launched the largest regenerative ranching program in the West, with 120 small family and Tribal ranchers in 13 states across seven million acres.

We are helping ranchers store carbon, measure it, and share their findings with other ranchers to meet the climate crisis head on.

CLEAN ENERGY



We secured \$3 million in 2022 to help electrify farms in the Northwest through our E-Farms partnership. We're starting by deploying electric tractors to working farmers and scaling up to electric trucks and other equipment.

Electric tractors reduce greenhouse gas pollution by 85% and reduce fuel costs for farmers by 90%.

RESTORING THE KLAMATH BASIN

After two decades of Tribal and nonprofit advocacy, the largest dam removal and restoration effort in U.S. history is underway!

In 2022, the federal government transferred the license. Seed collection and propagation began to restore land beneath the reservoirs. And engineers made plans for reservoir drawdown and dam demolition, which will take place in 2023 and 2024. Sustainable Northwest is excited to continue supporting dam removal, and working in the upper basing to improve water quality, quantity, and fish and wildlife habitat.

PORTLAND AIRPORT



Sustainable Northwest is proud to have played an instrumental role in sourcing all of the wood in PDX Airport's new main terminal from family and Tribally owned forests practicing ecological forestry in Oregon and Washington. The wood in the floor, ceiling, and roof is testimony to the Northwest's incredible forests, mills, and wood products professionals. The terminal will be ready in 2024.

WILDFIRE



Our forest program raised over \$6 million to help small forest landowners impacted by the 2020 Labor Day fires in western Oregon's Cascade Mountains.
